Opportunity for members of the public to raise issues with the Council (<u>2 mins maximum</u> <u>PP)</u> on any items relating to the agenda. Also, a chance to receive a report from the District & County Councilors. Once the meeting has been opened, <u>no further comment</u> may be taken without the agreement of the Chairman.

- 1. Apologies & Absence- To receive apologies and note absence.
- 2. Declarations of interest & consider request for dispensations to receive declarations from Councillors, any DPI 's (disclosable pecuniary interest or simply an interest termed a personal interest in the Code the Council adopted) relating to any items on the agenda for September 17th 2024. (Councillors should also remember that even if they do not stand to gain in any personal way, also to be considered is the public's perception of whether a councillor might gain by being influenced or using influence in a personal capacity.)
- **3. Minutes of the last meeting-** To confirm and sign the minutes of the Full Council meeting held on August 20th 2024, and the minutes from the Tender meeting 27th August 2024. (distributed by email & hand).
- 4. Committee Meetings- To note the minutes from the Planning & Finance meeting held on 3rd September 2024, and to agree staff & associate cost for September 2024 as stated on payment schedule 03.09.24.
- **5. Petition-To discuss and resolve** if the Parish Council carry on with the petition and re word it in another way.
- 6. Proposed changes to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF): The government's proposed updates to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) are wide-ranging and aim to support housing growth, sustainable development, and economic resilience. Key changes include mandatory housing

targets and a new formula to meet the goal of building 1.5 million homes. Local plans will need to identify 'Grey Belt' land within the Green Belt for development, and there will be clearer guidelines for affordable housing and public interest criteria. Additionally, planning fees, especially for householders, could rise, and the government may update local plan intervention rules to ensure housing delivery targets are met.

These reforms also priorities economic growth in key sectors like digital economies and renewable energy, including through support for onshore wind farms. The consultation on these reforms is extensive, and given the complexity NALC has issued an online survey to gather views from local councils and county associations to shape a collective response.

The purpose of the LDG is to provide information to local planning authorities, developers, and all stakeholders on the types of infrastructure where Gloucestershire County Council may seek funding to mitigate the impacts of the proposed development; to make it acceptable in planning terms

The LDG needs to be periodically reviewed to ensure it reflects the latest published national and local guidance. The existing LDG was adopted in March 2021. The public consultation is open from Monday 8 July until Sunday 29 September,
